### Date: 05/02/2024 Monthly Club Meeting

1. Called meeting to order: 7:00 PM Members attending: 29

- 2. Approval or correction of the previously published meeting minutes. April meeting cancelled due to inclement weather.
- 3. Guests/New Members: Joe Green was accepted. He was a former member and has experience with multiple types of aircraft.
- 4. President's (John Stoney) report: John introduced Chet and Terry Van Scyoc, owners of RC Country and long time supporters of our club. Chet gave a short history of his father's founding and development of the store from 1979. They moved and expanded the operation a few times to the present location on Power Inn Rd. with 14 thousand square feet. He described the changes in the industry over the years, like having manufacturers setting up booths at swap meets. Before opening a Q & A session with the members, Chet generously donated some fine merch which the club will add to our raffle collection for future events. The club deeply values the relationship which has existed with the Van Syoc family.
- 5. Vice President's (Dick Belden) report: Dick reminded us of the proper use of the gate lock. The code must be in place to LOCK it, then the combo must be changed. He also reiterated the <u>requirement</u> to have a TRUST number. We should all be courteous at the field and ensure everyone has a chance to fly. Many members are not comfortable fly-

ing with multiple aircraft airborne. (See Safety Officer's report) Dick commended Alan Ross for his recent mowing.

  - A. Our old frequency board is defunct. It was suggested that we install a Dry Erase Board (whiteboard). Anyone using 72mhz would simply have to post his channel on the board prior to turning on the transmitter.


Fred won the coveted outhouse, but it was felt that Dan deserved a special award. He was unable to attend to receive it.
